DESTINATIONS AFTER ARDEN

We are immensely proud of the destinations reached by Arden Sixth Form students.

Last year, the majority of the cohort went to a university, with over a third going to the top Universities in the country. Arden graduates are currently studying at both Oxford and Cambridge Universities with the vast majority of students having taken up their first choice of university.

There is an ever increasing diversity of destinations, with a sharp increase in students pursuing the apprenticeship route. Last year, student achieved degree apprenticeships with Deloitte, JLR and the RSC. The opportunities on Degree Apprenticeships and Sponsored Degrees are increasing every year. We have students currently studying on the PWC Flying Start Degree programme, an Aerospace Engineering Degree Apprenticeship and an Atkins Engineering Degree Apprenticeship as well as having previously taken up places at JCB, IBM and National



TRANSITION

We appreciate that adapting to life in the Sixth Form can take time. Whether you've been at Arden for five years already or are joining us for the first time, it can take time to settle.

We hold a Taster Day once the GCSEs are finished where students take part in lessons to give a flavour of what is to come and help to get a feel for life in the Sixth Form.

Our Enrolment Day takes place on the day of the GCSE results. The enrolment process is designed to ensure you are making informed choices based on your GCSE results and have thought carefully about your subject choices.

The step-up from GCSE to A Level studies needs to be actively dealt with. As a result, we run a study skills session at the start of Year 12 and regularly revisit the concepts throughout the two year course.

In addition to the in-subject support we are always reviewing and improving our holistic study support. After a study skills session with an external provider, Elevate, study skills are periodically introduced, revised and developed to ensure the most efficient use of study time. These sessions also allow a greater degree of personal mentoring. Students are able to discuss their achievements and difficulties with a member of staff. They are also used as a forum for exploring the wider world and the realms of general knowledge that some universities feel are lacking in today's students, as well as developing soft skills, which are vital in the wider community.

FUTURES

FUTURES CONFERENCE

There is a dedicated careers event put on each year in a conference style programme, students attend interactive sessions facilitated by external speakers from apprenticeship providers, degree apprenticeships, sponsored degrees, universities and past Arden students. The aim of this conference is to help students make informed choices about their future.

MOCK INTERVIEWS

During Year 12, every student is also given a mock interview. This involves facing an external visitor to school in a one-to-one setting and having to answer a range of questions. Many students find this a daunting prospect, however the feedback afterwards is always overwhelmingly positive and it helps create confidence as students encounter real interviews in Year 13.

APPRENTICESHIPS

The final group who need special attention are those applying for some of the most sought for post-18 options: degree apprenticeships and higher apprenticeships. We have an increasing number of students who, year on year, achieve a place that ensures they will leave university with no debt; genuine work experience and training. In combination with the school's career hub, these students are trained with regards to interview skills and assessment centres in order to ensure they can take advantage of the outstanding offers from some of the top firms in the country.





UNIVERSITY APPLICATIONS

The post-18 application process is a well-established practice, with a huge amount of experience amongst the staff involved. From guidance and support with choices, through to personal statement and CV writing help, we are with the students every step of the way.

We have many students who are interested in applying to some of the most competitive courses. Applying to study at either Oxford or Cambridge, or for a degree in Medicine, Dentistry or Veterinary Science, not only gives you a UCAS deadline 3 months earlier than everyone else, it increases the pressure on the application being the best it can be.

OXBRIDGE

The Oxbridge group meet regularly to practise their speaking and interview skills as well as being encouraged to develop their learning with supra-curricular activities. A session might involve discussion of wide ranging questions or an A Level Maths student introducing the group to non-Euclidian geometry or another talking about the way early modern Chinese art changed the course of history. We are part of the Solihull Oxbridge Network and attend events during the year. This is a group of schools from the area, including grammar schools and Solihull School, who are pooling resources to ensure the most effective preparation for all students. This means that they have regular access to conferences where information, expertise and hints are shared from our link colleges; Former students share their experience and expertise with regards to applications and what one needs to do in order to succeed.

MEDIVETS

Similarly, the MediVet group also meet regularly to work on interview skills but also to discuss and engage with all elements of the wider knowledge expected for applications in this field. Again, we are supported by a wide range of exstudents (some who have now qualified as doctors) who come in and share their expertise. Wander into a session and you might find students discussing Medical Ethics; the role of the GMC; perhaps a medical news story or, most excitingly, practicing role plays such as delivering bad news.

Arden prides itself on a pastoral support system where everyone is valued and cared for. A personal tutor is assigned to each student on joining the Sixth Form who will be the guide through the complexities of the next two years. These can often be a time of high pressure; balancing happiness with the personal ambitions and the challenges of A level requires a dedicated support team who have years of experience.

CARE & SUPPORT TEAM AT ARDEN SIXTH FORM

Arden's pastoral care is both detailed and personal. This closely focused support structure is built around personal tutors, with whom every student meets daily at registration, as well as opportunities for private progress meetings. Our tutorial programme covers a range of important topics from Self- Esteem to Growth Mindset, and issues relating to online and personal safety. We also have specific Career and Personal Development lessons on a fortnightly basis in order to ensure all students get the full support in understanding the complex world around them as well as enabling them to reach their destination of choice

An extended pastoral team provides more specialised emotional and personal assistance where required. We have a full time Pastoral Support Assistant who is available to talk to students on a one-to-one basis when the need arises.

The Sixth Form Leadership team is made up of staff with many years of teaching and pastoral experience. We support every individual student through the A Level journey, in whichever way is necessary.

It is of course also extremely important to engage parents in students' academic success. The Parents' Consultations are augmented by regular progress reviews and intervention meetings, as required.

These important academic snapshots record personal development towards established targets, helping both the student and their parents/guardians gauge progress and help iron out any personal or academic issues in good time.

BEYOND THE CLASSROOM

The relationships you will build with your teachers will be different to your previous experience. You will be treated as an adult and work with your tutor to meet and exceed challenging goals.

Arden promotes a culture of self-development, providing numerous opportunities to build the extra qualities universities and employers want. We encourage you to be intellectually curious and extend your interests in subjects and careers in which you feel an aptitude and affinity.

We have many students who are interested in applying to some of the most competitive courses that are out there. Applying to study at either Oxford or Cambridge, or for a degree in Medicine, Dentistry or Veterinary Science, not only gives you a UCAS deadline 3 months earlier than everyone else, it increases the pressure on the application being the best it can be. We have set up specialist support for this group of students which is led by our dedicated Oxbridge, Medics, and Apprenticeship Lead. There are regular afterschool sessions for each group and scheduled interview and assessment preparation. We have extensive experience in supporting them in their applications and a record of success.

We have recently further expanded our provision by joining the Solihull Oxbridge Network. This is a group of schools from the area, including grammar schools and Solihull School, who are pooling resources to ensure the most effective preparation for all students. This means that they have regular access to conferences where information, expertise and hints are shared from our link colleges; the opportunity for mock interviews with teachers they are unfamiliar with and academic enrichment sessions to stretch them beyond the bounds of the A level curriculum. In the past few years, ex-students, currently studying at Oxford and Cambridge have enjoyed supporting us with this. We firmly believe that the 'road to Oxbridge' should be a journey that is enjoyable and enriching whether or not the final destination is achieved.

Real life work experience is becoming a vital part of a student's development. Some careers demand it; all recommend it. Every year we have a Work Experience Week, where students are encouraged to find a suitable placement, which will help them develop skills beyond the classroom. Each individual student researches and sources their own work experience suited to their own needs. The 2023/24 cohort gained a huge amount from their work experience and it is great to see our 2024/25 cohort making links already using the Arden Network to create links with barristers for internships and work experience.

The time spent on work experience can prove invaluable, often serving to reinforce a possible career path, or to provide you with the knowledge to enable you to decide it's not for you. The opportunity to experience the 'real world' is an important element of many of Arden's courses.

Arden's reputation for Music and Drama is well deserved; both areas provide the chance to perform to a high standard or build experience behind the scenes in production, set design and lighting. For instance, in our recent production of 'Beauty and the Beast' our Sixth Formers played many of the lead roles—with the our Year 11 lead immediately joining the Sixth Form afterwards; BATS is a Sixth Form and Year 11 choir; Ardenaires is a Big Band full of talented musicians; our Chamber Choir, Wind Band, String Orchestra and Chamber Orchestra all provide superb opportunities for involvement.

For those with a sporting interest, we enter teams into national cups for both football and rugby. We are proud of our Sixth Form Team's success in winning last season's Football Solihull Cup and support the time taken to create sporting excellence.

There is plenty of opportunity to 'give back' by joining in with regular fundraising activities along with community outreach work, such as supporting our PTFA and other local organisations. We are constantly expanding the opportunities for charitable giving.

PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT

You do not come to Arden Sixth Form just to get a set of qualifications. We are passionate about providing opportunities to expand beyond the curriculum and students have regularly commented that they are surprised at the breadth of what they are offered outside the classroom.

The Extended Project Qualification (EPQ) is a significant part of Arden Sixth Form. This is a fantastic opportunity to develop interests and knowledge beyond the classroom. It is becoming increasingly valued as part of a Post-18 application. We have a dedicated EPQ lead as well as highly supportive EPQ mentors.

Core maths continues to increase in popularity with students who want to continue this aspect of

their learning but have chosen 3 A levels that do not include maths. It is part of the breadth of education that helps Arden students achieve their academic goals but also develop their confidence and become such well rounded indivuduals.

Students are expected to take part in at least two hours of enrichment activities a week. The activities have ranged from volunteering in the local community to supporting lessons across the school. We have successfully entered the Young Enterprise competition for the last 3 years. There are sporting opportunities and the offer of taking part in a MOOC (Massive Open Online Course).

Essentially, whatever a student's interests, Arden is there to support and encourage participation. This broad spectrum of activities plays an invaluable role in enhancing and enriching the learning experience for a Sixth Former at Arden.

The breadth of EPQ projects is a testament to the way in which Arden nurtures individual ideas and passions. From designing and creating artefacts such as go-karts, quad-copters and remote control hovercrafts, to essay based projects such as "Quantum Mechanics", "Was Shakespeare a feminist?" and "What makes a psychopath?".

LEADERSHIP OPPORTUNITIES

Arden has a very powerful student voice. Students' perspective, ideas and concerns are sought out at every level from the form room to the classroom and beyond. SUBJECTS ON OFFER



THE ARDEN CURRICULUM

Arden provides a range of A Level courses that offer a solid foundation for successful future with twenty seven subjects currently on offer. Due to being academic curriculum, there a common academic purpose which is taught by specialist staff with wide experience of teaching to the highest levels possible.

In addition to the full A Levels, we also offer a one course in Core Mathematics that can run alongside the three A Levels in Year 12. Students can also opt to take the Extended Qualification (EPQ) part of their as enrichment programme.

The success or failure of A Levels can depend totally on what subjects are chosen, so put as much thought into this as possible. We advise you to speak to your current teachers and Sixth Form students who are studying the subjects you are interested in to ensure you are making a fully informed choice.

APPLICATION GUIDANCE

The combination of subjects that you choose for Year 12 will influence your future pathways, so carefully consider both your subject choices and possible career plans. We have tried to maximise the number of possible permutations. We appreciate there will be some preferred subject combinations that are prohibited by our subject blocks but ask that you spend time considering alternatives, if necessary. We are happy to provide guidance, if required. Experience tells us that those who choose subjects based on enjoyment, passion, skill or a sharply defined career goal settle quicker into the courses and make better progress.

We also believe that utilizing study time wisely will mean that less time is spent studying at home and allowing for more enriching activities. Hence, we have outlined our expectations below:

- Attend school all day, every day, from 8.40am until 3.30pm. In Year 13, students will attend school from 8.40am until the final lesson of the day unless on monitored revision.
- Display an excellent attitude to learning.
- Be active in learning both in and out of lessons.
- Be a role model to all the younger students in the school.
- Attend all lessons, assemblies and morning tutor periods, plus any additional enrichment sessions, unless ill, when the school will be notified.
- To notify school of any absence.
- To maintain a high level of punctuality.
- To scan in on arrival on the school site and scan out at the end of the day.
- To arrive on time for all sessions with the necessary equipment and resources for each class.
- To wear the appropriate dress code and visibly wear the identity badge (lanyard) at all times when on Arden premises (even during study time).
- To listen to and respect the opinions of others.
- To submit all work set by deadline and seek permission in advance if this is not possible.
- To only use a mobile phone/headphones/ear-buds in the Sixth Form block during break, lunch and study periods.
- To use Social Media in a mature and responsible manner.
- To check personal email and other school systems for any messages on a daily basis.
- To conform to the expectations of student drivers: cars are not to be brought onto the school site and not to be parked within 1 mile of the school premises.
- To not be collected or dropped off on school premises when taking a driving lesson.
- To understand that if any of the above is not adhered to, the Sixth Form Disciplinary Policy will be followed.



ARDEN SIXTH FORM DRESS CODE

We strongly believe that a smart appearance creates the best atmosphere for learning and, as a result, achievement reaches its full potential.

The expectations are:

Male Students

- A smart suit
- A formal shirt
- Arden Sixth Form tie (available at Early Years or Palmers)
- Smart shoes



- A smart suit or a smart tailored jacket with trousers/skirt or smart dress, suitable for a school environment.
- A formal shirt or blouse
- Smart shoes

General

In the cold weather, students may wear a plain dark cardigan or V-neck jumper under their jacket. Hooded tops are not permitted. A jumper is not a replacement for a jacket. Skirts, dresses or trousers that are judged too short or tight are not permitted.

No denim, lycra or stretch material is permitted.

A shirt or blouse that is judged as low cut, cropped, transparent or revealing is not permitted.

Unnatural colour hair dye is not permitted.

Piercings are only permitted in the ears.

Students should adhere to this dress code or will be sent home to change.
