

KS4 – Year 10 – History

Term	Topic Titles	Brief Overview
1	Early Elizabethan England, 1558–88	Students study England during Elizabeth I, looking at the problems she inherited as a monarch, both problems at home and abroad, and consider how successfully she dealt with these problems.
2	Weimar and Nazi Germany, 1918–39	Students study the problems and unrest in Germany at the end of World War One, and the creation of the Weimar Republic, and how the problems and developments in the early 1920s led to the rise of the Nazi Party, concluding with studying how the Nazi party created a dictatorship in Germany from 1933-39.
3	Superpower relations and the Cold War, 1941–91.	Students study the breakdown of the relationship of Russia and America, particularly in 1945, and the growing ideological differences which led to 45 years of tension in Europe and the world. This includes the reasons why tension increased in the late 1940s, how nuclear weapons added to tension and fears, and key 'flashpoints' of the Cold War in Europe and Cuba before looking at the reasons why the Cold War came to an end by 1990.
