

KS5 – Year 13 – History

Term	Topic Titles	Brief Overview
1	Paper Three: The British Experience of Warfare 1870-1918	Students focus on the developments of the French Wars including the Battles of Trafalgar and Waterloo, and the contributions of Nelson and Wellington as commanders. They then study the Crimean War and some of the key developments during that war, including an evaluation of the role of Lord Raglan. Students study the developments of the two phases of the Boer War, including the problems Britain faced and how they overcame them, and an evaluation of the commanders during the Boer War.
	Coursework	Students spend some lessons completing coursework independently in class, with a completed draft to be handed in at Christmas. One lesson per fortnight spent on exam-skill focused revision.
2	Paper Three: The British Experience of Warfare 1870-1918	Students study the developments of the First World War, including some of the key battles and an evaluation of Douglas Haig as a military commander. Students then focus on the technological developments of the first world war, focusing specifically on the war in the air and its role in victory.
	Coursework	Students spend some lessons completing coursework independently in class, with a completed piece to be handed in at or shortly after February half term. One of the four lessons per fortnight is spent on exam-skill focused revision, with a further lesson spent studying the 'breath' unit of the British Warfare course, looking at the patterns of change and continuity across the whole time period 1870-1918.
3	Revision	Students spend their time in term three specifically focusing on skills based exam revision and preparation.
