

## KS5 – Year 12 – History

Term	Topic Titles	Brief Overview
<b>1</b>	Paper One: Germany 1918-1989	Students spend the first term looking at the Weimar Republic in Germany from 1918-1933, considering the problems Germany faced and how the newly created republic dealt with those problems.
	Paper Two: Italy 1911-1946	Students study the first two units of the course: Liberal Italy 1911-1918 and the Rise of Fascism 1918-1922, focusing on the problems that a unified Italy faced at the beginning of the 20th Century and the impact of World War One leading to increasing divisions and tensions in Italy which led to the popularity of Fascism and Mussolini.
<b>2</b>	Paper One: Germany 1918-1989	Students study two additional periods: Nazi Germany (1933-1945) and the Federal Republic of Germany (1949-1989). They will examine the political, social, economic, and military impact of the Nazis, including the historical interpretations of the causes of World War Two and how Nazi Germany's defeat led to the creation of the FRG. Students will focus on the political, social, and economic developments in the FRG.
	Paper Two: Italy 1911-1946	Students study two further units from the course: the Fascist state 1922-1940, and Mussolini's foreign policy and the decline of the fascist state 1922-1946. In the Fascist State unit, students will look at the social, political and economic changes Mussolini introduced, including its descent into dictatorship, before concluding with the decline of Fascism as a result of their relationship with Germany and the impact of World War Two.
<b>3</b>	Paper Three: The British Experience of Warfare 1870-1918	Students study the initial context to their learning for year 13, overviewing the key wars studied, and learning about the initial part of the French Wars which start the study period.
	Revision and Controlled Assessment	Students consolidate some exam skills through revision, and are introduced to and begin preparation for their independently-researched 4000-word coursework piece to be completed in the first two terms of year 13.
