E-safety is extremely important and pupils at Arden will follow a planned programme of age relevant e-safety work from Year 7 to Year 13. They will look at how to be safe online in all subject lessons where ICT is used, as well as through form time activities and special assemblies during every year. Topics include: cyber-bullying, online predators and sexting.

We encourage teachers and pupils to use ICT as part of everyday teaching and learning, but as the internet and new technologies are being developed and changed every day it is important that staff, parents and pupils remain vigilant to possible threats and risks.

We have an e-safety group which helps to review polices and look at how Arden supports students to stay safe online. This group is made up of subject teachers, pastoral staff, ICT support staff, governors and parents.

Student Digital Leaders are involved in delivering key messages to other pupils through assemblies in the Autumn term each year. They also ensure that E-safety reminders are displayed in classrooms across school.





What does our data say?

HRBQ survey (Year 8 & 10 - July 2014)

55% (56%) of pupils responded that their parents/carers are always aware when they use the internet

42% (43%) of Year 10 boys said parents were aware when they used the internet

What does our data say?

HRBQ survey (Year 8 & 10 - July 2014)

14% (18%) of pupils responded that they have met someone in real life whom they first met on the internet

30% (29%) said that they had seen pictures online that had upset them

Percentage answering that they use social media and share images of themselves:

Year 8 Boys 48% (46%)
Year 8 Girls 67% (62%)
Year 10 Boys 74% (60%)
Year 10 Girls 86% (83%)

17% (17%) of pupils responded that someone has shared an image of them on social media which made them feel unhappy.

Year 8 Girls 20% (16%)

Year 10 Girls 28% (25%)


